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Crossroads Middle School BYOD Guidelines

The following guidelines were developed to ensure that BYOD is successfully implemented to support the learning process at the middle school level. Students will lose the privilege of using their personal devices if the following guidelines, or district policy, is violated. In addition, students may also receive disciplinary action, as per the Code of Student Conduct.

1. Students will discuss BYOD with their parents before bringing a device to school.
2. Students will only be permitted to use their devices to support and enhance their educational experience. In addition, students will use their devices in a responsible and ethical manner.
3. Students will keep their BYOD device on silent and non-vibrating mode while on school grounds, and comply with each staff member's expectations regarding BYOD.
4. Students will access the school's wireless BYOD Network when using their devices.
5. Students are not permitted to use devices in the **bathroom, cafeteria, hallway, locker room, and gymnasium.**
6. Each staff member will determine when student-owned technology and headphones can and cannot be used in the classroom.
7. Students are not permitted to use their devices to take pictures, record audio, or video on school grounds/buses, unless under the supervision of a staff member.
8. Students are responsible for the safety, security, loss, damage, operation, and charging of their personal devices. The school will not be held responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen devices.
9. Students are not permitted to print from their personal devices.
10. Administrators have the authorization to collect/examine a device if a violation of the AUP is suspected.
