Minutes of the Board Meeting of February 6, 2017

The South Brunswick Township Board of Education met on Monday, February 6, 2017 in the Auditorium at Crossroads North School. The meeting was chaired by President Mr. Harry J. Delgado.

CALLED TO ORDER AND SALUTE FLAG - Mr. Delgado called the meeting to order at 7:06 pm and asked the audience to stand for the pledge of allegiance.

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REPORT OF THE INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT - Dr. Gary McCartney

Mr. Delgado read the Resolution of Affirmation (A. 1.16) on the consent agenda this evening affirming South Brunswick School District's commitment to diversity.

Mrs. Baig commented that the community celebrates diversity and religious beliefs and the resolution confirms it.

Dr. McCartney reported the following:

- The next Parent Academy will be held on Thursday, February 9 at Crossroads North Middle School from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm entitled *Heartfulness: Guided Relaxation Practice for Balanced Living*. Parents can register online and childcare will be provided for children over 3. Children over five years old are invited to attend the workshop.
- Kindergarten registration for the 2017 - 2018 school year will be held on February 15 at each of the elementary schools. Children eligible for kindergarten must be five years of age by October 31. Staffing determines enrollment, Dr. McCartney encouraged parents to register their children as soon as possible.
- K-2 reports cards will be sent home on February 14.
- February 17 schools will be closed for students, a professional development day for teachers. An opportunity for teachers to refine and learn new schools. Schools will also be closed on February 20 for Presidents Day.
- The next scheduled board meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 21.

Dr. McCartney discussed resolution A.1.15 on the agenda this evening, calling for a moratorium on new charter school seats in Middlesex and Somerset Counties, created through the approval of new facilities and/or the expansion of existing facilities. He discussed the impact the Charter School expansion has on the district budget and the taxpayers which funds a majority of the budget. The district currently operates a \$140 million dollar budget and only \$24 million comes from the State.

Dr. McCartney announced he met with the State Board of Education today and asked for their endorsement of the resolution.

Superintendent Search

The intention is to finish up by the end of February and announcement will be made thereafter.

Dr. McCartney announced January is proclaimed Board of Education recognition month in New Jersey. The recognition meeting scheduled for January 21 was rescheduled to this evening due to inclement weather.

Dr. McCartney commended the board for all the important work they do. Principals, Bonnie Capes and Jodi Mahoney on behalf of the principals also thanked the board for their work. Students from Crossroads performed and Mrs. Mahoney read a poem in honor of the board. Principals handed out a token of appreciation to each member of the board.

Board Members thanked Dr. McCartney, the Principals and the students for the recognition.

2017 National Merit Semi-Finalist Student Scholars and Honored Educators

Peter Varela, Principal of South Brunswick High School

Mr. Varela announced tonight we are fortunate to recognize students who have been selected as the 2017 National Merit Scholarship Program Semi-Finalists. South Brunswick High School is recognizing 15 semi-finalists and 13 are in attendance this evening. The top 16,000 out of 1.5 million students who took the PSAT are selected. There are also 34 commended students that have been selected and will be recognized at a later board meeting. Mr. Varela also thanked his secretary Maryann Murphy and Madeline Daniels, Assistant to the Superintendent for their assistance in preparing for this evening's recognition.

Mr. Delgado announced he was very proud this evening and also congratulated the students and staff.

Dr. McCartney asked all parents to stand and be recognized for their commitment to their child's success. He commended the teachers and students for their hard work.

PRESENTATION – PARCC Update - Suzanne Luck-Born

Mrs. Luck-Born announced this was the third year of the PARCC Assessment. In 2015, six schools, Brunswick Acres, Brooks Crossing, Monmouth Junction, Crossroads North, Crossroads South and South Brunswick High School fell short of the 95% participation rate for any subgroup. Districts are required to submit ESEA Accountability Action Plans to the Department of Education for each school not reaching the participation rate.

In 2016, there were five schools that fell short of the 95% participation rate, Brooks Crossing, Cambridge, Crossroads North, Crossroads South and South Brunswick High School. ESEA Accountability Action Plans are on the agenda for approval this evening and will be submitted after approval. PARCC meetings to improve participation rates are being scheduled and will be posted on the district website.

PARCC testing for this year for elementary schools will begin after spring recess.

Updates on PARCC are available through several communications - Friday Folders, Score Reports, Principal Newsletters, Assessment Website, Third Grade Parent Night, and the PARCC Parent Advisory.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – Lee Blankstein, Resident of Dayton, asked the board the future of the new superintendent moving forward and commented that board members should not be friends with the superintendent.

Dr. McCartney and Mr. Delgado acknowledged Mr. Blankstein's comments.

It will also be used for the cost of installing the playground equipment and bench.

1.8 Approve Professional Services for Therapy Services - That the Board of Education approve Princeton Speech-Language and Learning Center to provide executive functioning therapy services and social skills therapy services. These services are necessary for a student turning 21 and transitioning out of school. These services were agreed upon as an alternate to placing the student in an out-of-district placement for this final year. The therapy services for executive functioning will be billed at \$160 per session (20 sessions) and for social skills will be billed at \$180 per session (20 sessions) or \$118 per group session (40 sessions). These services will not exceed the cost of \$10,740.

1.9 Approve Professional Services for Itinerant Teacher of the Deaf – That the Board of Education approve Summit Speech School to provide itinerant teacher of the deaf services. These services will include a review of CST records/progress reports/grades, student observations, a review of the current IEP and program recommendations. These services are necessary to determine if bringing the student back to the district from his out-of-district placement is an appropriate transition. These services will be billed at an hourly rate of \$225 and will not exceed the cost of \$2,250.

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1.10 Approve Professional Services for 1:1 Staff – That the Board of Education approve Sunbelt Staffing to contract 1:1 special education paraprofessional for Greenbrook School. These services are approved by the Superintendent for a multiply disabled student. These services would be for the remainder of the school year at an hourly rate of \$35.00. It is projected that these contracted services would not exceed the cost of \$19,000.

1.11 Approve the 2016 ESEA Accountability Action Plans – That the Board of Education approve the attached 2016 ESEA Accountability Action Plans.

1.12 Approve Student Field Trip Destinations – That the Board of Education approve the student field trip destinations as per the attached for the 2016 – 2017 school year.

1.13 Approve Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying Report – That the Board of Education approve the determinations and recommendations submitted by the Superintendent, through the date of this meeting, regarding the disciplinary consequences and/or remedial actions as required by the State of New Jersey under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights.

1.14 Approve Resolution for Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement –

WHEREAS, the South Brunswick Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. requires Board members to receive prior approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel only as described in NJOMB Circular Letter 06-02, including amendments or revisions thereto, a threshold amount below which Board approval is not required; and

WHEREAS, travel and related expenses not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq., but deemed by the Board of Education to be necessary and unavoidable are excluded from the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq.; and

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves all travel not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. as being necessary and unavoidable as per noted on the attached Board of Education Approval of Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement Form; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves the travel and related expense reimbursements as listed on the attached Board of Education Approval of Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement Form.

1.15 APPROVE RESOLUTION OF THE SOUTH BRUNSWICK PUBLIC SCHOOLS BOARD OF EDUCATION CALLING FOR A MORATORIUM ON NEW CHARTER SCHOOL SEATS IN MIDDLESEX AND SOMERSET COUNTIES, CREATED THROUGH THE APPROVAL OF NEW FACILITIES AND/OR THE EXPANSION OF EXISTING FACILITIES –

WHEREAS, the Charter School Program Act of 1995 (the "Act") authorizes the creation of charter schools to service students whose respective communities have identified a desire for alternatives to traditional public schools; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that individuals interested in creating a new charter school include parents and/or other stakeholders of the community in which the proposed charter school will be located; and

WHEREAS, the Act further requires that all charter schools have an approved district or region of residence made up of public school districts, which district/region of residence represents the community that the charter school was created to serve; and

WHEREAS, there are currently five charter schools in Middlesex and Somerset Counties, with a sixth having been approved in October 2016 with tentative opening of September 2018, which schools serve the following communities pursuant to their approved district/region of residence:

- a. Hatikvah International Academy Charter School ("Hatikvah"): East Brunswick;
- b. Thomas Edison EnergySmart Charter School ("TEECs"): Franklin, North Brunswick, and South Brunswick;
- c. Central Jersey College Prep Charter School ("CJCP"): Franklin, North Brunswick, and New Brunswick;
- d. Greater Brunswick Charter School: New Brunswick, Edison, and Highland Park;
- e. Academy for Urban Leadership Charter School: Perth Amboy;

WHEREAS, a number of these charter schools have applied to the NJDOE seeking to expand their current programs, enrollment and locations; and

WHEREAS, a sixth charter school, Ailanthus Charter School, was approved by the New Jersey Department of Education ("NJDOE") in October 2016 to serve students in Franklin and New Brunswick beginning in September 2018; and

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WHEREAS, the current number of seats across existing charter schools in Middlesex and Somerset counties for the 2016-2017 school year, according to available public records, is 2,316; and

WHEREAS, the number of charter school seats throughout Middlesex and Somerset counties, according to available public records, will increase by 128% to 5,283 if all of the outstanding expansion applications are granted and Ailanthus is granted a final charter by the NJDOE; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the districts of residence pay the charter schools for each student from their respective communities enrolled in those schools, thereby draining funds and diminishing money available to serve students in the traditional public schools; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOE has interpreted the Act to require all public school districts statewide to pay charter schools for students enrolled in those schools regardless as to whether the charter serves that district's community as part of the charter's approved district or region of residence; and

WHEREAS, any increase in charter seats will have a negative impact on public school district funding, with the proposed 128% increase in such seats in Middlesex and Somerset counties likely to lead to drastic and debilitating cuts throughout the public school districts in those counties; and

WHEREAS, unlike charter schools, public school districts are consistently underfunded by the State despite the requirements of the School Funding Reform Act and are also subject to a mandatory 2% cap on increases to its local tax levy, which prevents public school districts from raising funds to cover the damage caused by increased charter school seats; and

WHEREAS, the existing charter schools located in Middlesex and Somerset counties are already lacking in demand in their own designated communities and the expansion of these schools will only exacerbate this issue; and

WHEREAS, in direct contradiction to the letter and spirit of the Act, many charter schools are seeking to expand in order to enroll additional students from districts outside of the charter schools' approved districts or regions of residence due to a lack of interest from students who live in the very communities for which the charters were created to serve; and

WHEREAS, TEECS, CJCP and Hatikvah have all filed applications seeking to expand their enrollment despite the fact, according to data available for the 2016-2017 school year, and while 96% of the students enrolled in TEECS reside in that school's region of residence, only 87% of the students enrolled in CJCP reside in that school's region of residence, and only 48% of the students enrolled in Hatikvah reside in that school's district of residence; and

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WHEREAS, TEECS and Hatikvah enroll a significantly more segregated student body than any of the resident or non-resident sending districts with respect to race, socioeconomic status, and need for special education; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Education and the Courts have repeatedly determined that the practice of segregating students must be ended, not perpetuated under the guise of parental choice or "freemarket" competition; and

WHEREAS, it is unclear as to whether the NJDOE gives due consideration to the increased segregation of students caused by expanding charter schools; and

WHEREAS, it is also unclear as to whether the NJDOE gives due weight to the financial burden on districts of residence and other public school districts impacted by increasing charter school enrollment when considering applications for new or expanded charter schools; and

WHEREAS, there is a lack of publicly available studies and/or statistical analyses conducted by the NJDOE with respect to the segregative and financial impact of charter school expansions on the vast majority of students remaining in the traditional public setting;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby implores the New Jersey Department of Education to conduct a full, open and thorough analysis of the potential impact that the expansion and addition of charter schools in Middlesex and Somerset counties will have on each public school district throughout the State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a moratorium be imposed on the approval of any application to expand or create any charter school in Middlesex and/or Somerset county until such time as the NJDOE analysis can be properly completed and the results of which can be shared and discussed with the public; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby requests the assistance of its local and State representatives in ensuring that the NJDOE conducts the necessary charter school impact analysis and that the public school districts of Middlesex and Somerset counties receive their fair share of funds so that they can continue to provide a thorough and efficient public education to all students; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Acting Commissioner of Education, the Acting Director of the Office of Charter Schools, State Senator Christopher Bateman, Assemblyman Jack M. Ciatterelli and Assemblyman Andrew Zwicker, State Senator Teresa Ruiz and the Senate Education Committee, Assemblywoman Marlene Caride and the Assembly Education Committee, State Senate President Stephen Sweeney, and Assembly Speaker Vincent Prieto.

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1.16 APPROVE RESOLUTION OF AFFIRMATION – THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION APPROVES THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION OF AFFIRMATION -

WHEREAS, the South Brunswick School District both embodies and embraces community and student diversity, and

WHEREAS, the corresponding culture and climate of our public schools are enriched through a multitude of beliefs, ideas and approaches, and

WHEREAS, the recent national political rhetoric that speaks to limitations and restrictions based upon ethnicity, religious beliefs and national origins raises the specter of exclusion, discrimination and isolationism, and

WHEREAS, South Brunswick School District, as a New Jersey public school, operates in accordance with all federal and state statutory mandates that require a free and appropriate public education for all children, and

WHEREAS, the time-honored and long-standing principles that form the cornerstone of our democracy are predicated on a system of free public schools for all,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the South Brunswick Board of Education wants to affirm its commitment to all children who enter our schools, that they are welcomed with open arms to engage in world-class educational opportunities, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the South Brunswick Board of Education reaffirms its commitment to provide safe and stimulating learning places for all students, regardless of ethnicity, religious beliefs or country of origin, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the South Brunswick Board of Education offers its fervent pledge, while operating within the laws that govern public education, to uphold the ideals of public education, to continue to embrace the richness of our diversity and to represent the educational needs of all of our students regardless of race, creed or national origin.
